

Special Commissioner Meeting  
July 7, 2010  
At the Newdale City Building

Present were Commissioner Romrell, Commissioner Hurt, and Commissioner Miller

Also present was Clerk Abbie Mace to take minutes.

Present from the City of Newdale were Mayor Shayne Hansen, City Council Members: Chad Stevens, Lisa Nelson, Dal Schwendiman, and Ken Stoul and City Clerk Susan Lott.

Commissioner Romrell thanked the city for allowing us to attend their meeting. He explained the county is willing to help the City with Road Oil projects.

Commissioner Hurt explained the economic development fund we set aside for projects for Cities in the county. We are willing to help when we can with projects.

Commissioner Miller explained that we have a Zipper to grind up asphalt that is a great tool.

Councilman Lisa Nelson was concerned about the truck route here in Newdale. There are several concerned citizens of the City. They are concerned with all the traffic going down the alley to General Mills and Walters Produce.

Commissioner Romrell asked if anyone owns a right of way with the railroad. No one knows if there is a recorded right of way. Commissioner Hurt told the City the contact for East Idaho Railroad. It was suggested that the City work with Public Works Director Marla Vik to research right of ways.

There were also concerns with traffic on the main road going north out of Newdale motorist travel fast and people jumping from the bridge.

The commissioners suggested the City work with the Sheriff about kids on 4-wheelers and playing basketball on the main street of Newdale.

Commissioner Miller told the City about a Search and Rescue water safety video.

Commissioners agreed to have Road & Bridge post no fishing, or jumping from bridge.

Commissioner Romrell explained the roles of the Elected Officials.

Commissioner Romrell expressed concerns with all the 1M license plates he saw in Newdale. He explained way the gas tax is distributed. He suggested they promote Fremont County residents register their vehicles in Fremont County to keep the gas taxes in the county to maintain county roads.

The county would be willing to help with upgrading the truck route road.

The city asked about a Compliance Officer for the county. The city would like to contract with that compliance officer. The commissioners are in the process of hiring an officer. The county would look at a proposal.

The city thanked the county for coming to the meeting. The commissioners thanked the city and look forward to working together in the future.

There being no further business to come before the board, the meeting was adjourned.
