I wish to become an Idaho Master Gardener. I understand that I must attend 36 hours of classes, finish all quizzes and exams and complete 40 hours of hands-on-training to become certified. I understand that I can sign up for more than one hands-on-project and I can volunteer for more than 40 hours.

I agree that I will abide by all regulations and recommendations of the University of Idaho Extension System, including its policies on diversity and civil rights. I agree to give University of Idaho pest control recommendations even if they include synthetic chemical pesticides. I understand that as a Master Gardener, I am considered a volunteer representative of the University of Idaho. Therefore the University of Idaho will assume liability for my pest control recommendations, but only if my recommendations are limited to control measures that are in accordance with label directions, approved by the University of Idaho for home garden use, and listed in Cooperative Extension publications.
